How to apply

The trustees meet twice a year to discuss applications for funding from the Gwyn Arch Foundation. These meetings take place in June and November, so applications should reach trustees (via the website <https://www.gwynarchfoundation.org.uk/> or by email to info@gwynarchfounadation.org.uk by **31 May** for consideration in June, or **by 31 October** for consideration in November. Grants are made available to successful applicants within two weeks of decisions being made.

As a reminder, the Gwyn Arch Foundation's purpose is: *"To support the development and performance of choral music by and for young people within the Thames Valley."* Once you have completed the form, you can email it to us at the address above.

CONDITIONS OF BEING AWARDED A GRANT FROM THE GWYN ARCH FOUNDATION

1. All successful applicants in receipt of a grant, should send the trustees an evaluation of how the award was used, within two months of the event being completed. (Successful applicants will be sent an evaluation form to complete).
2. Reference should be made of the support received from the Gwyn Arch Foundation on any publicity material, programmes or online information (website, social media etc) connected with your project or event. (PDF of our logo will be made available to successful applicants).
3. Grant awards are currently being made for specific “one off” projects. Applications for ongoing operational expenses will not be considered at this time.
